Part II: Chronology

25 September 2007 Appellant convicted of one count of indecent assault on a child

committed in 2003; sentenced to imprisonment for two years

with a non-parole period of 15 months; sentence suspended.

(CAB 7-8 [5], CAB 36 [2]-[3])

	27 August 2010	Appellant convicted of one count of aggravated indecent assault on a child committed in 2007. Appellant sentenced to imprisonment for two years and six months with a non-parole period of one year and six months. (CAB 8 [6], CAB 37 [6]-[11])
10	24 February 2015	Appellant convicted of three counts of failing, as a registrable offender, to comply with reporting conditions without reasonable excuse, contrary to s 44(1) of the <i>Child Sex Offenders Registration Act 2006</i> (SA) and one count of possess child pornography contrary to s 63A of the <i>Criminal Law Consolidation Act 1935</i> (SA), both committed in 2013; sentenced to imprisonment for 15 months with a non-parole period of 12 months; suspended after six months. The Crown appeals against the sentence. (CAB 38-9 [20]-[21])
	26 June 2015	Attorney-General files application pursuant to s 23 of the <i>Criminal Law (Sentencing) Act 1988</i> (SA) for the detention of the appellant until further order.
20	25 September 2015	Supreme Court of South Australia (Nicholson J) allows the Crown appeal against sentence and resentences the appellant to imprisonment for 16 months with a non-parole period of ten months, (backdated to 10 April 2015); sentence not suspended. (CAB 39 [22])
	19 February 2016	The Supreme Court (Nicholson J) makes an order pursuant to s 23 of the <i>Criminal Law (Sentencing) Act</i> that the appellant be detained in custody until further order. (CAB 6-28)
	10 August 2016	End of the sentence of imprisonment imposed on resentencing by Nicholson J on 25 September 2015. (CAB 41 [28])
	1 March 2018	Appellant files application for release on license pursuant to s 24 of the <i>Criminal Law (Sentencing) Act.</i> (CAB 30-32)

	30 April 2018	Sentencing Act 2017 (SA) commences operation. Criminal Law (Sentencing) Act repealed. Section 59 of the Sentencing Act replaces s 24 of the Criminal Law (Sentencing) Act.
	25 June 2018	Sentencing (Release on Licence) Amendment Act 2018 (SA) commences operation, amending ss 57-59 of the Sentencing Act.
	12 October 2020	Supreme Court of South Australia (Hughes J) refuses the appellant's application for release on license: <i>Hore v The Queen</i> (2020) 285 A Crim R 94. (CAB 34-65)
10	16 December 2020	Appellant files a notice of appeal to the Court of Appeal against the decision refusing the application for release on license. (CAB 67-71)
	7 May 2021	Court of Appeal (Kelly P, Lovell and Bleby JJA) dismiss the appeal: <i>Hore v The Queen</i> (2021) 289 A Crim R 216. (CAB 73-82)
	4 June 2021	Appellant files application for Special Leave to Appeal to the High Court of Australia.
	21 February 2022	Special Leave to Appeal granted. (CAB 86)
20	4 March 2022	Appellant files notice of appeal to the High Court of Australia. (CAB 88-89)
