

Classroom Activities

Ideas to engage your students with the Tasmanian Dam Decision and its impact on Australian society



Create a class mind map of wonderings around the High Court of Australia, the environmental movement, the Australian Constitution, the three levels of government and their responsibilities.

Design a diagram to identify Australia's court hierarchy and the powers of the High Court of Australia.



Develop a glossary of new terms and ideas, including environmentalism, common law, statutory law, jurisdiction, international treaties, and the Constitution.

Explore the stories of the players involved in the case -Tasmanian Wilderness Society, Tasmanian citizens, Tasmanian Parliament, as well as the federal liberal and labour parties.





Create a timeline of key events that led to the Tasmanian Dam decision.

Examine one of the many ABC articles or videos celebrating the anniversary of the Tasmanian Dam decision. What does your source say about the impact of this case on Australian society and the environmental movement? Compare the perspectives to a newspaper article from 1992 (Stuck where to start? Try Trove).





Investigate the opening statement of the High Court judgment and Chief Justice Gibb's introduction - what do these reveal about the role of the High Court, and the responsibilities of federal and state governments.
